

Rate sheet

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My rate is \$175 an hour, and it covers everything: reading the file, correspondence, travel time, the meeting itself, and the follow-up afterwards.

Time is recorded in tenths of an hour — a tenth is six minutes — and every invoice lists what each entry was for, in plain words, so you can see what you are paying for.

The hour ranges below are what this work has taken in past cases. They are a guide to what to expect, not a quote, and you are billed for the time actually worked.

Consultation only

Support and preparation without me in the meeting.

- Initial phone consultation — Free
- Initial document review & follow-up phone consultation — 1–3 hours
- IEP file review, service report review, and preparation — 1–3 hours
- Review of documents & strategy meeting prior to IEP — 1–3 hours
- Report of recommended services and supports — 1–3 hours
- Post-meeting consultations & correspondence — 1–2 hours
- Final IEP document review & dissenting statement if needed — 1–3 hours

Consultation and meeting attendance

The same preparation, and I sit beside you in the meeting.

- Initial phone consultation — Free
- Initial document review & follow-up phone consultation — 1–3 hours
- IEP file review, service report review, and preparation — 1–3 hours
- Pre-meeting consultations & initial correspondence to district — 1–2 hours
- Review of documents & strategy meeting prior to IEP — 1–3 hours
- IEP meeting including travel time — 2–5 hours
- Post-meeting consultations & correspondence — 1–2 hours
- Final IEP document review & dissenting statement if needed — 1–3 hours

Ways families usually work with me

New Family — First time working together

For families who have never had an advocate in the room, or who are heading into an initial

IEP or evaluation.

- Free 30-minute consultation
- Full file review — IEPs, evaluations, provider reports
- Strategy meeting before the IEP
- Correspondence with the district in advance
- I attend the IEP or 504 meeting with you
- Final document review, and a dissenting statement if one is needed

Returning Family — We've done this before

For families I already know, coming back for an annual IEP, a progress check, or a new concern.

- Review of what's changed since we last met
- Annual IEP preparation
- I attend the meeting with you
- Post-meeting follow-up and correspondence
- Final document review, and a dissenting statement if one is needed

The first call is free
